Daily Turn Outs:

Turn out preferences: All horses are turned out for one turn out period per day- seven days a week. Horses are not turned out together. I try to set it up so your horse is in his stall when you are most likely to ride. I cannot promise you your preference but take into account all horse's medical needs first then owner's preferences. During bad weather night turn outs are during the day and other shifts shortened. Severe weather may eliminate all turn outs. Number by preference with no number for options you don't want. Shadysprings Farm decides which horses will go in what turn out or pasture.

Fly Season: All horses will be fed Solitude for fly control- April 1 through October 1. You will be billed our cost for this feed through control. We have had excellent results with Solitude. You are responsible for fly spraying your horse and we will not provide that service. I have found that Tri-Tec is long acting. We will put fly sheets and masks on if you provide them.

Blanketing: You have three options for blanketing.

_____ Turn Out Over Blanket: We will add turn out over stable blanket for going out and removing when horse comes in

_____ No Changes: We will leave blankets as is

_____ Off inside/ On outside: No blanket in stall/ turn out sheet when outside

If your horse bites, kicks, etc. for blanketing, we have the option to not blanket this horse.

Stall Cleaning and bedding:

Stalls are cleaned 7 days a week. Please do not clean your own stall or add extra shavings to your stall.
